1. How do people say “hello” in your language?
2. How do people say “hello” in other languages?

Approximately 400 million people in the world speak English as their native language. The majority of them live in the United States, the United Kingdom, Canada, Australia, Ireland, and New Zealand. When people in these countries meet, they usually say "hello," "hi" or "hey." This is informal and friendly. But they use other greetings too.

When you visit a different country, people often say "hello" or "hi" in English. It's polite to learn how to greet them in their language.



In other cultures there are different ways to say "hello" and be polite. In Thailand, people put their hands together and say "Sawadee."

Traditional Maori people in New Zealand rub noses. In Japan people bow. In the United Kingdom, it is polite to shake hands when you meet a person for the first time. But in Morocco men shake hands with their male friends.

In many countries, it is polite for people to kiss on the cheek when they meet. But how many kisses? In Brazil, you kiss one cheek. In Spain you give two kisses. And in Russia, you give three kisses.

Finally, in Tibet people have a very unusual way of greeting. They put their tongues out! Occasionally, an offensive action in one culture is a polite action in a different culture.
